Flu Keeps The Kids At Home

Absenteeism in Farmington schools is running about 10 per cent above average, according to School Administrative Assistant Byron Oliver.

Oliver would not attribute all absences to Hong Kong flu, but told The Enterprise & Observer the illness might be causing the high ratio of students being out of school.

Teacher absenteeism, said Oliver, is about seven or eight per cent, with 10 to 15 more teachers absent than usual. Probably because the flu is highly contagious, the higher rate of absences seem to hit one school at a time. Eleven were absent in one day at East Junior High last week, 10 the next day at Dunckel Junior High. The junior high schools and elementary schools seem to be harder hit than the high schools, where absenteeism has been about normal.
