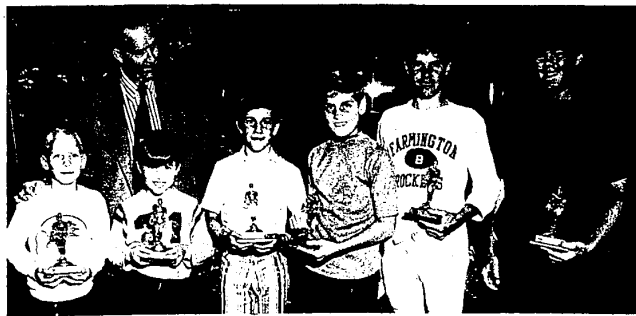

In this contest, boys punt, pass and kick a football, and the total distance obtained for each event is measured.

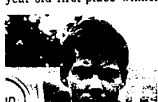


Arthur Hanlon, 11-year-old, was the nine-year-old first-place winner.

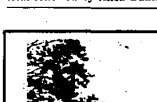


Randy Meier, 12-year-old, was the 12-year-old first-place winner.
