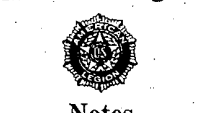


American Legion

Essay Contest Open To Pupils

All students in Farmington High School will be eligible to participate in the seventh annual Veterans' War essay contest which closes in April.

Principals of all high schools are being contacted and additional information on the contest can be secured from them. "Only For Victory" is the title of this year's essay. Mrs. Howard Middlewood is serving as chairman for the local contest.

Local prizes will be given by the Wayne County Council of Veterans of Foreign Wars. Schools of the three highest winners will each receive a \$30 plaque. First prize is \$25; second prize, \$15; third \$10; and there will be 10 prizes of \$2 each, and 10 of \$1 each.

Winners of the aforementioned prizes will automatically be eligible for state awards. First national prize is \$1,000 and a gold medal. There are three other major prizes in the national contest, and a large number of consolation awards.

National judges include Dr. James E. West, chief scout executive of the Boy Scouts of America; Mrs. William Kleiter of Portland, Oregon, president of the National Congress of Parent Teachers Associations; and the Rev. Father Edward Joseph Flanagan, famous as the founder of Boys' Town.
