## Mobile Unit May Be Secured

With the declaration of war comes intensified need by the Army and Navy for donations of blood plasma for emergency transfusions. As a preparedness measure, the American Red Cross through its blood donor service has had under way for several months a program to procure for the Army and Navy donations of human blood from 200,000 civilian volunteers. This project now becomes a current war need.

The Japanese attacks which launched hostilities found capital ships and hospital ships of our Pacific Fleet supplied with processed dried plasma secured through the Red Cross program. Further supplies were in the Philippines for use of the armed forces there. Under existing censorship regulations no announcement of the exact amounts on hand or of their disposition will be made.

Both Army and Navy will rush further shipments of the plasma

to the Pacific coast for war use as quickly as the blood donations are made and processed. Distributed to ships of the Navy on both oceans and to points of danger, including distant posts and stations, the means of saving the lives of soldiers and sailors suffering from shock following injuries, hemorrhage and burns. Usable even under the confused conditions of battle, these units of the processed liquid content of human blood, can be administered in transfusions without waiting to determine the blood type of the victim or donor.

The Blood Donor Service was organized by the Red Cross in cooperation with the National Research Council at the request of the Surgeons General of the Army and Navy after a preliminary program of 15,000 donations proved the feasibility of procedures and methods. It operates through 16 metropolitan chapters where blood donor centers are maintained. Each of these is necessarily within 12 hours shipping radius of one of the seven laboratories where the

elaborate equipment required for processing the blood has been installed. Cooperating in the enrollment of donors are numerous chapters in surrounding areas covered by mobile units operating from the blood donor centers. These bring to nearby towns staffs of physicians and nurses with necessary equipment to be set up temporarily in different localities.

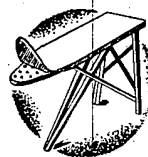
Of the metropolitan chapters participating in the Red Cross Blood donor program those in New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Rochester, Buffalo, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh, Detroit and St. Louis are already in operation.

Oakland County has been organized by the Red Cross so that cities and towns therein may have the use of this unit when they are ready. Mr. Harry D. Hoey, of Bloomfield Hills, is chairman of the Oakland County blood procurement program for the Red Cross and arrangements for visits of the Mobile unit to any locality are made through him.
