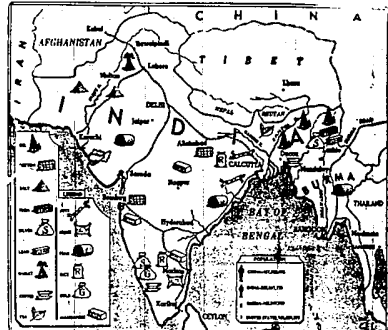

The MacArthurs, accompanied by the General's Aides, made a hazardous trip from Bataan Peninsula by speedboat and thence by plane to Australia, where the General took over the command of the United Nations forces in the Pacific. This photo was radioed to London from Melbourne and then rereadied to New York.
