## How to 'Enlarge' Michigan Farms for War Output

CHICAGO.—How Michigan farmers can "enlarge" their farms to meet increasing war-time femands without incurring the hazards of over-expansion was described in a statement made public here by the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee

mittee.
"The secret lies not in buying more land but in making the present acreage do a better production job," the statement declares. "This means following a soil management program that will raise the land's fertility level.

"Even in the most productive areas the average farm can usually be enlarged the equivalent of 10 per cent, and sometimes as much as 50 per cent, through intelligent soil treatment, including the use of

"In combination with other sound farming practices the use of fertilizer containing nitrogen, phosophorus and potash is essential in stepping up the soil's productive capacity! Such a practice hot only has an immediate result in increasing the per acre yield of crops needed in the nation's war effort, but represents an important long range soil conservation measure.
