SPRAY CALENDARS DISTRIBUTED TO FRUIT GROWERS

Printed below is a letter sent by Karl D. Bailey, County Agricultural Agent to fruit growers in this area, regarding spraying of fruit for 1942. It is reprinted in full, inasmuch as some farmers may not have received the letter and it carries important information to all fruit growers.

Please find enclosed your copy of the 1942 Spraying Calendar. After you have read it carefully, file it for future reference, because we are informed that we should not expect to get any more for three or four years. Due to the shortage of paper there were only a few thousand copies printed. We have asked for 450. For the following years we may get leaflets to supplement our spraying calendar giving us results from the experiment station.

Just a few things to remember: 1. Dormant sprays should be applied when the plants are dormant. 2. Any commercial sprays should be used at the manufacturer's recommended strength. 3. The source of leaf-curl on peaches is always present on trees. It takes just the right weather conditions for development. You cannot predict the weather, so always spray early and thoroughly for good results.

4. Do not use zinc sulphate without the proper amount of lime (See Sec. 33 of the Spraying Calendar).

5. Apple scab must be controlled early. 6. We are of the opinion that this year will be no exception so watch for leaf beetles, cut worms, codling moths, curculios, leaf hoppers, berry moths, fruit flies, Oriental worms, all kinds of fungi, etc.

7. It is our job as producers of food stuff to do our best for our boys in the service ourselves and for humanity. (Food is a foundation of peace and a peace maker after war time.)

8. Crops cannot be harvested until they are grown. Let's get them in. We will try to harvest them. Where there is a will there is a way.

We will try to give you timely hints as to seed treatment, fertilization, cultivation, spraying, thinning cover crops, soil erosion during the coming season.

REGISTRATION OF INSTRUCTORS DUE APRIL 16

April 16, 1942 has been set aside for the day of registration of instructors for the various services under the Oakland County Defense Council.

There have been many requests for instructors for the various services under the protective organization. In order to determine the number of individuals desirous of attending the instructors school, Thursday, April 16, has been designated as a registration day at the Washington Junior High school auditorium in Pontiac, Michigan at 7:30 p. m.

The instructors training courses will cover the following subjects: Bomb Squad, Rescue Squad, Auxiliary Police, Air Mail Wardens, Auxiliary Fire Squad, Messengers, Fire Watchers, Demolition and Clearance Crews, Road Repair Crews, and Decontamination Squads.

"It should be understood that this training course is for the purpose of training instructors and that they should fairly well represent the whole county," Milo D. McIntock, Executive Secretary of the Oakland County Council of Defense, stated.

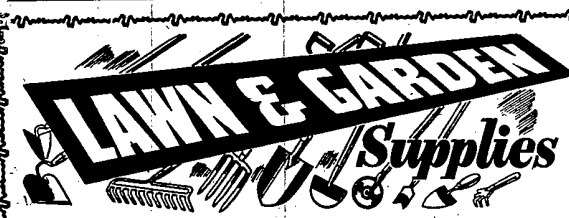
McIntock added, "We suggest that each unit in the county send representatives to registration on April 16, for the purpose of making available to every community, instructors in all protective services."

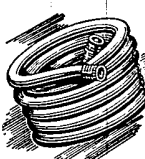
