Proclamation

WHEREAS, the week of May 3rd to 9th, inclusive, has been designated by the American Legion as National Employment Week, in an effort to call the attention of the public to the need of training older workers, so that they may be able to take their proper places in war industries and

WHEREAS, thousands of younger workers now employed in war industries will take their places in the ranks of the armed forces as soon as replacements can be trained, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States and the Governor of the State of Michigan have galloped special attention to this great need of complete mobilization of labor for the war effort,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Delos Hamlin, Mayor of Farmington do designate the week of May 3rd to 9th, inclusive, as National Employment Week, and urge all church and civic organizations, business groups and employers in general to stimulate the registration of our total man power to the end that all who have skills will be properly registered with the United States Employment Service for assignment to war industries, and those who lack skills can receive proper training.

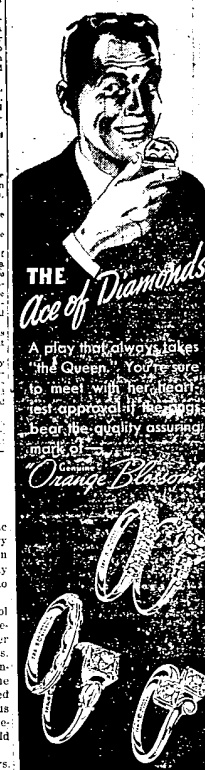
