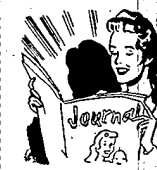

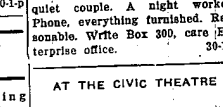

The theme of the Day Camp, to be held this year during the week of June 22 through 26 at Shiawassee Park, will be "Simple Outdoor Living". It is announced by Mrs. H. R. Locker, chairman of the Day Camp Committee of the Local Council of Girl Scouts, sponsor of this project.

It is felt that the threat to freedom and the democratic way of life today makes it imperative for every community to see that its children receive the best possible training in democracy. Also to live simply, easily and comfortably in small groups out of doors is more necessary than ever before. It has long been recognized that a camp, offering as it does opportunities to work together and share the responsibilities and freedoms of living in one of the best training schools in democracy.

In the camp, there is opportunity to build health and to establish in the child a feeling of self-sufficiency and self-reliance that will be invaluable in these times when children are left increasingly to their own devices. RATION BOOKS ISSUED LOCALLY TO 2,843 PERSONS

A total of 2,039 applications for sugar ration books were received during the four registration days last week, at the gymnasium of Farmington High School. Of this number, 195 did not receive books due to excess sugar on hand, but 2,843 books were issued.

All day Monday registrations were taken, with 35 persons acting as registrars, and on the other days registrations were taken during the afternoon and evening.
