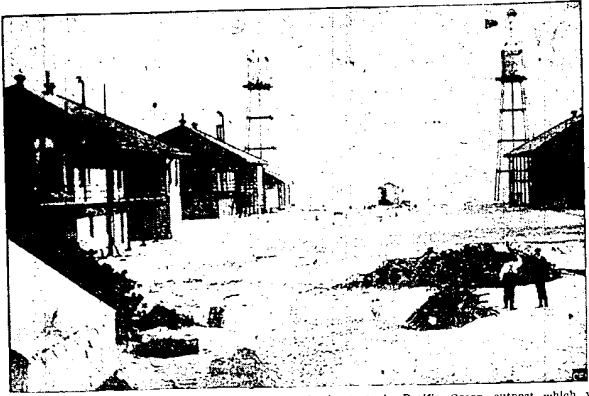


JAPS ATTACK MIDWAY
