VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR RED CROSS WORK

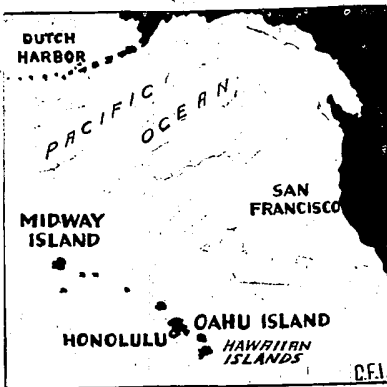

The map shows the strategic position of Hawaii, Midway Island and Dutch Harbor. Hawaii is believed to be the main objective of the Japs but the enemy at present has been concentrating forces on Dutch Harbor where air attacks were made last week and on Midway Island which also has been under attack. Sunday, June 7 the enemy appeared to be withdrawing from Midway with serious losses to them, but it is believed that action is continuing in the Alaskan sector.
