

# W.S.C.S. HEAR LECTURE ON JAPANESE PEOPLE

At their meeting last Thursday afternoon members of the Women's Society for Christian Service enjoyed an exceptionally interesting talk by Miss Marion Simons of Ypsilanti, on the subject "The Japanese People." Miss Simons was for some years in charge of social settlement work undertaken by the Methodist Church in Tokyo, and later in Nagasaki. In January, 1941, she was ordered home by the

Methodist board in anticipation of the war. Her lecture was a most helpful one in that the Japanese Christians she knew and worked with were not in sympathy with the war party, and had less expectation of war breaking out than we in the United States.

During the meeting, Mrs. Fred Cook led a brief memorial service for Mrs. Josephine McGee, who has been an active member of the Methodist Church for many years. At the business session preceding the afternoon program action was taken to have a Christmas bazaar this year.

On July 15, a picnic for members of the W.S.C.S. and their children will be given at noon in the Shawnee Street Park behind the school. Mrs. Harry Page is chairman of the picnic arrangements.
