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RED CROSS NOTES

The regular yearly water safety program of the Oakland County Chapter of the American Red Cross began this week at fifteen beaches. Classes are scheduled at Smith's Landing at Lakeville, Stevens Beach at Stony Lake, Lake Orion City Park, Bald Eagle Lake, Deer Lake, Macedeo Lake, Orchard Beach at Cass Lake, Cunningham Park at Sylvan Lake, Pontiac Yacht Club, Shady Beach on Upper Straits Lake, Chetolah Shores at Elizabeth Lake, Seven Harbors at White Lake, Walnut Lake and Wing Lake.

Regardless of increased activities, the public still is vitally interested in Red Cross First Aid classes. It was revealed by Dr. E. B. Cudney, chairman of this program. To meet the continued demand, new classes are being organized regularly, the majority of which are for persons active in civilian defense work. A number of other classes are planned for the general public and will be announced soon.

Chapter reports show that 22 Red Cross first aid classes have been completed since January by civilian defense groups and another 22 classes are still in progress in Pontiac alone. Many are also meeting in the County.
