ON DEC. 20 the Landmark developers appeared before the Farmington City Council with a study prepared by Samuel Walker, traffic

engineer.

Walker presented statistics to show that the restaurant traffic, if properly routed, would not create traffic heards.

The council asked its traffic consultant, Tapan Datta Goodel, Grievas and Associates, to test Walker's findings and report back.

THE COUNCIL last week appointed John Courville to the city's Zoning Board of Appeals to fill the unexpired term of Delos Hamlin, who resigned.


