FIRE DEPARTMENT PUTS OUT BLAZE AT ACCIDENT

An unusual accident occurred early Monday morning at the corner of Grand River and Eight Mile Road, when the driver of a truck carrying 281 bushels of apples fell asleep and crashed into the rear of another truck loaded with calves, pigs and sheep.

The apple truck burst into flames and the Farmington Fire Department was called to put out the fire. None of the occupants of either truck was infured, but it was necessary to shoot two pigs which had been badly burned, and two lambs which were injured when they were buried beneath an avalanche of apples. Roasted apples were scattered all over the comer, and the odor was much the same as that of a cider mill.

Emergency E's Ordered For OCD Personnel

The Civilian Detense Council for the City and Township of Farrington, at a regular meeting on Monday evening, set up a new signal to act as a warning in case of an air raid.

The signal, which will be used in all future blackouts, will be three rounds of three minutes each, with a 30 second interval between each round. The intervals will easily distinguish the air raid alarm from the fire siren which is a continuous sitern. The complete air raid warning will last for the minutes, and the all-clear signal will be a continuous siter for two minutes.
