America's most modern and best equipped Mobile Canteen Unit has been put into service by Metropolitan Detroit USO. It is operated by the Salvation Army, and was donated to USO by the West Side Class C Operators of Detroit.

It serves free coffee and dough nuts to draftees at the Army In-duction Center, to State Troops on



The Mobile Canteen Unit is mounted on a half-ton Chevrolet chassis. It has two 10-gallon vacuum urns for dispensing hot coffee and keeping it hot for a period of eight hours, complete cooking equipment, storage and refrigeration space.
