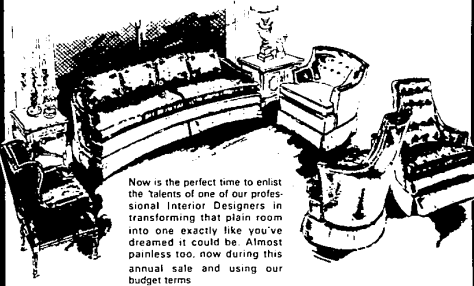
**Club To Hold Art Afternoon**
