Karpczuk took a pass from Brian Said and scored only 18 seconds later and Franklin had cut the score to 3-2.

At 5:29, Bob Juntilla scored for Franklin on an unassisted goal and the game was notched at 3-3, with the final period to play.

PLAY went back and forth during the first half of the period but Franklin's Doug Cumming was detected elbowing at 7:09 and the Patriots were a man short.

Churchill was all around the Patriot net and Franklin goalie Wayne Oliver was

pulled out of position leaving the net open. Defenseman Griff Roberts fell into the goalie crease for Franklin and smothered the puck and was given a two-minute delay of game penalty.

The Patriots were two men short and Churchill's McIntosh scored his second goal at 8:58 unassisted and the Chargers were up, 4-3.

CHURCHILL collected its assurance goal at 10:04 with

Bob Rion scoring on a power-play set up by Brad Berger, and the Chargers were up 5-3. Each team managed eight shots on goal in the third period with the game delay penalty proving to be the turning point for Franklin.

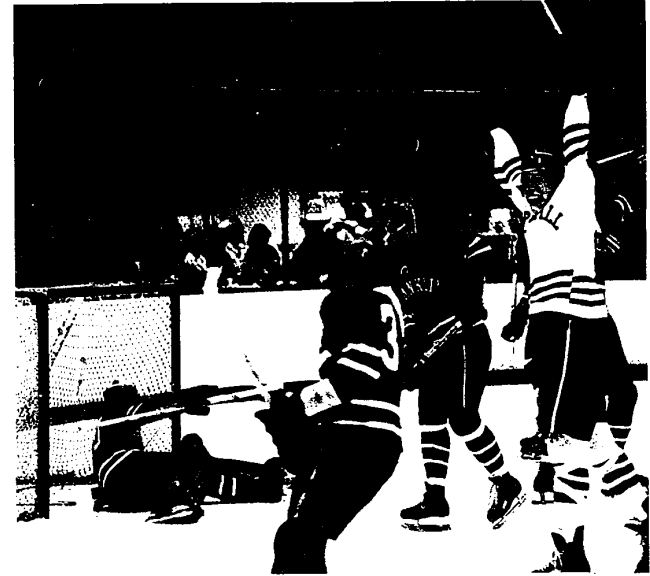

John Glenn stands tall in Northwest Suburban League action with an undefeated 3-0 basketball record and the Rockets are flying 7-1 overall with a Belleville holiday

journey loss the only blemish. Glenn's latest victim was North Farmington which sits at the bottom of the Northwest Suburban conference with a 0-3 record and hold a 2-6 overall account.

Glenn topped North, 85-60 with the Rocket starting five

Glenn and North Farmington battled almost even in the first quarter with Glenn managing a 16-13 lead. The Rockets spurred in the second stanza, obtaining as much as a 15 point advantage but North caught up and trailed at the half, 39-30.

"We had many opportunities to break the game wide open but we failed to make good on their mistakes," said Glenn Coach Gordon Davis. "Instead we made some mistakes and kept them (North Farmington) in the ball game."

GLENN outscored North in the third quarter, 20-15, and the Rockets held a commanding 59-45 lead going into the final stanza. Glenn exploded with 26 points and coasted to an easy 85-60 win for its seventh victory.

Bowling Leader Dies At Age 63

Ellis Walker Sr., well known in bowling circles two decades ago, as the captain of the Ira Wilson team in the All Star Classics, died in Hollywood, Fla.

Under his leadership the team won several classic titles and with such bowlers as Johnny Crimmins, and some of the other stars, the team was rated with the best in the state.

After he retired from bowling Ellis operated the cocktail lounge at Grandmont Recreation on Grand River Avenue. He sold that operation two years ago and was stricken shortly after 1 moving to Florida.

Glenn hit 13 per cent from the floor, 35-81. North could muster 27 per cent on 20 of 74. North hit 20 of 34 from the line and Glenn popped in 15 of 26.

THE ROCKETS out-rebounded North, 46-37, with Carlington collecting 12 and Horton 11 for the winners and Dave Ellsworth totaling 13 in the losing cause.

Glenn meets Franklin Friday on the Patriot court. "We have two tough games coming up," said Davis. "We have Franklin Friday and Oak Park the following week."

"These two games will tell the success of our season and we look for a real physical battle with Franklin."
