## LIQUID AIR IS DEMONSTRATED AT ASSEMBLY

The first of a series of six paid assembly programs, arranged for the students of Farmington High School, was given last Wednesday morning in the school auditorium. Elliot James was the lecturer and he gave a most interesting demonstration on liquid air. He performed several experiments among them the freezing of a handkerchief in liquid air, breaking this handkerchief into bits after it had been frozen. He also froze a column of mercury, and freezing rubber, he drove it into wood, as one would drive a nail.

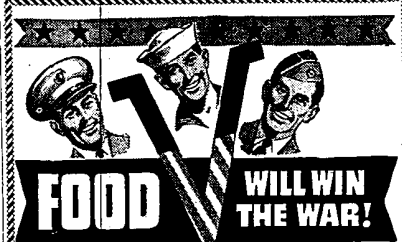
