Mending Furniture Scratches
A professional job can be done in repairing scratches on furniture through the use of a shellac which is obtainable at paint stores in a color to match your furniture finish. Begin by dampening a small cloth pad in alcohol and rubbing it cross grain over the scratch, being careful not to dampen too large an area. The alcohol will soften the finish and smooth the sharp, broken edges. Soften the shellac stick over it match or spirit lamp and work into the scratch with a flexible knife blade until the opening is filled. Smooth the surface with very fine sandpaper and wax.

METHODIST PREACHING MISSION BEGINS SUNDAY

Beginning Sunday night, November 8, and going through Thursday, there will be five nights of services at the Methodist Church. They will be known as the preaching mission. Every Methodist Church in the Detroit district is having such a mission this coming week. The services will urge the importance of evangelism and the commitment of our lives to Christianity in these times. The minister, Howard C. Busching, will preach on the theme "Abiding Realities in a Changing World," the subjects for the five nights being God, Human Nature, The Atonement of Christ, The Way of Love, and Christian Fellowship.

Special music has been arranged for every evening. Sunday night Mr. Irving Dixon of Detroit will be the organist and Mr. Nelson Smith of Detroit will play a violin solo. Monday Mrs. William Harris will play the organ and Mrs. June McNeil of Detroit will render a vocal solo. Tuesday night Miss Edith Parker will be the organist and Miss Audrey Lathrup will sing a vocal solo. Wednesday Mrs. Murel Burdick will be the organist and Mr. Lloyd Forbes will sing a solo. Thursday night the church choir will sing, with Mrs. Burdick at the organ.

These services will begin at 7:45 each night, except Thursday. Thursday night is the regular monthly church family fellowship night. There will be a potluck supper that night at 8:30 and the service will follow the supper.

To all of these services the people of the city and vicinity are urged and cordially invited.

The morning service next Sunday, November 8, will prepare the way for the preaching mission. The sacrament of baptism for infants will be conducted, and new members will be received into the church. Rev. Busching will preach on Ephesians.

The Methodist Men's Club will attend as a body, the service on Tuesday night, which is their regular meeting night. After the service the men and their wives are invited to remain for fellowship and refreshments. The president, Foster Stewart, would like all the men to be present.

The Book Club, a young adult organization of the church, met Wednesday night at the home of Miss Ernestine Pierce, with 24 members and guests present. Dr. Sidney D. Eya of Detroit, former pastor, was the speaker.

Members of the Methodist Youth Fellowship are to attend the annual youth rally at Metropolitan Church, Detroit, Saturday night. Twelve hundred youth are expected. Dr. Rice will speak. Local youth who want to go should call Rev. Busching or Mrs. Edwin Louys.
