

An IMPORTANT BOOKLET entitled "Plant Efficiency," containing ideas and suggestions on how to increase production in war plants, has just been released by the War Production Board. The booklet opens with a two page section on the importance of good lighting. Here is a partial quotation from this WPB booklet:

"Good Lighting-Better Work

"Good lighting sharpens the worker's most important faculty-sight. It is an effective means of increas-ing shop efficiency and maintaining production at a high level.

"An adequate and well-designed lighting system brings to the plant: increased production, better workman-ship, less eyestrain, reduction in accidents, better morale . . .

"Lights and reflectors should be washed at interval dictated by shop conditions."

That last piece of advice from the War Production Board is especially important. According to a recent survey of lighting maintenance in war plants, dust and dirf. from manufacturing processes, if allowed to collect on lamps and lighting fixtures, will rob them of as much as 38% of their light output.

The city's recent growth has been
