Motion made by Nacker and supported by Hinger that the bills presented to the Commission for the month of October be paid. Roll Call: Nacker, Bagnall, Hulett, Hinger and Johnson. Carried, all yeas.

Minutes of the regular meeting held October 31st were read and approved.

Motion made by Nacker and supported by Hinger that the resignation of Kenneth E. Griffith be accepted. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Johnson that the agreement between School District No. 5 of Farmington and the City of Farmington regarding the Trway 38 Acres be executed. Carried, all yeas.

Motion by Hinger and supported by Nacker that the letter received from Mr. Hunt, Chairman of the State Drive, which was read by the City Clerk, be placed in the City files. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Johnson that the following resolution be passed as follows: Carried, all yeas.

"Mr. Chas. N. Andrews, who has been a respected citizen of Farmington for nearly two decades, recently celebrated his 100th birthday. State was admitted to the Union, and may well be envied the opportunity to have watched our Country develop from an infant among nations to the position of leadership which it today occupies. Therefore, be it resolved, that the Commission of the City of Farmington offer to Mr. Andrews and his family his hearty congratulations on this occasion."

Motion made by Hulett and supported by Hinger that the request of the American Legion for permission to erect a temporary honor roll for war men in the service from the City and Township be erected on the Farmington City and Township Hall lawn. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Hulett and supported by Nacker that the City pay Arthur Lamb Twenty Five Dollars per month for janitor service at the Farmington City and Township Hall. Roll Call: Nacker, Bagnall, Hulett, Hinger and Johnson. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Hulett and supported by Bagnall that the following resolution be made:

Whereas, the City Assessor has received notice from the Board of Supervisors to spread at large taxes in the amount of Seven thousand eight Hundred Forty-Six and 24/100 (\$7846.44) Dollars, hereinafter assessed against lands situate in the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan described as

Lots 4 to 69 Incl. Farmington Woods Subdivision.

And whereas, it appears that said Taxes were ordered charged against the City at large by the Auditor General by reason of representations made to him that said lands were being used for religious purposes, and were under the statute therefore exempt from taxation, and

Whereas, said lands consist of large residential lots platted for home sites, with roads and boulevard dedicated to the use of the public, all of which lots are vacant with no house of public worship or parsonage standing thereon, and are wholly and completely adapted to business, commercial and speculative purposes; and

Whereas, the City of Farmington was not represented before the Auditor General at the time said request was made of him to charge said taxes to the City at large and was given no notice or opportunity to be heard in opposition to such request.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved that the Assessor of the City of Farmington be and he is hereby ordered to forthwith re-assess and taxes against said lands, same to be collected with the taxes of the current year. And Be It Further Resolved, that the City Clerk mail a copy of this Resolution by registered mail to Yern J. Brown, Auditor General; the Oakland County Board of Supervisors and to Edward A. Mooney, owner of the record title of said lands. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Nacker and supported by Johnson that the meeting be adjourned. Carried, all yeas.
