

Service Honors Church Construction Workers

Those often-forgotten men of church-building—the workers who turn bricks and mortar and electrical wire and plumbing fixtures into a sanctuary—will be honored in a new Farmington church Sunday, Jan. 23.

A special service at 11 a.m. in University Hills Church, located at Farmington Road and I-96, will be dedicated to "all ye who labored" in the construction of the church, said Dr. J. Harold Ellens, pastor.

Final construction work is being completed on the church, which broke ground Easter Sunday in 1971 and was dedicated Dec. 19.

THE SERVICE honoring the construction workers will include short talks by Dr. Carl Droppers, architect who designed the contemporary building, and Henry Haberkorn, Orchard Lake contractor who headed the building work, as well as Dr. Ellens.

The pastor's homily will be concerned with the Trinity as expressed in the basic triangular design of the building and will be the first in a series of sermons on symbols of the church.


A litany of confession following his talk will begin with the words "These are our best efforts—receive them."

DR. DROPPERS, a member of the Cleveland firm of Chaty-Droppers and head of the architecture department at Case-Western University, will speak on "The presence and meaning of the Holy Spirit in this visible architectural design."

"We are delighted with a building that stands as a proclamation of the gospel!" is the start of the litany that will follow his talk.

Haberkorn's talk will be on the spirit of God in the Christian as expressed in the work of construction. The litany of dedication after his homily will begin with the words, "What we have done here defines us."

Special music for the occasion, arranged by Ronald Sharrette, director of music, will be performed by an instrumental ensemble, the youth choir of University Hills and the University Hills singers. It concludes with an arrangement of "Rise Up, O Men of God."

The Rev. Michael R. Dempsey, auxiliary bishop of Chicago, will speak at 8 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 27, in the parish's St. Catherine Hall, Beech-Daly at Pembroke, Redford Township.

His talk will be titled "The Great American Sleeping Beauty?" Bishop Dempsey was named in 1970 as the Catholic Church's national director of the Campaign for Human Development.

Program in Chicago. He is organizer of the first neighborhood employment center, Lawndale for Better Jobs.
