The Rev. Philip Rodgers Magee will begin his duties as senior pastor of Plymouth's First United Presbyterian Church on Sunday, Feb. 6. Rev. Magee is coming to Plymouth from First downtown Baltimore, Md., where has has been the minister for the past nine years. He succeeds Dr. Henry Walch, who retired last fall. Rev. Magee is one of the founders of the Central Churches of Baltimore, an inter-faith organization of 12 downtown Baltimore churches, and served six years as Chesapeake synod chairman of national missions.


