THE GARDEN PATH

Vegetables are only as good for us as the minerals we derive from them, and they can give us only as much mineral value as they receive from the soil.

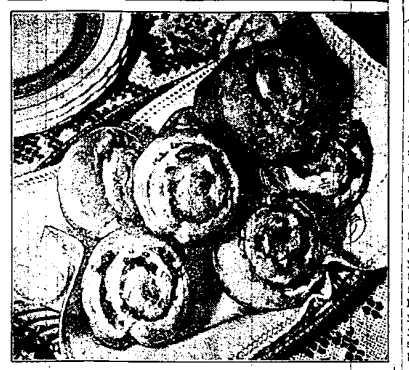
For annual vegetables: Make the initial application of plant food when the soil has been spaded and before the first planting.

Where vegetables are to be planted in rows, use two pounds of plant food for each fifty feet of row. When the soil is prepared, apply the plant food in a strip approximately six inches wide.

For crops grown in hills, such as cucumbers and melons, mix a level tablespoon of plant food thoroughly with the soil in the bottom of the hole, and cover with one inch of soil before setting out the plants.

Perennial Vegetables: Feed asparagus beds in early spring; and again when the last cutting is made. Use a complete balanced plant food, applying at the rate of four pounds per 100 square feet.
