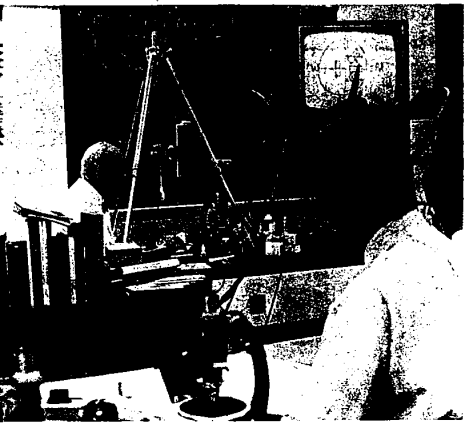


# Detectives Study At S'craft Famed Specialist Teaches Microscopy



DR. WALTER C. MCCRONE, international expert in the field of microscopy, teaches a two-week intensive course in the use of the microscope for 36 officers and civilian employees of the Michigan State Police, the Detroit Police Department, and the Michigan Department of Health. The classes are the first of their kind to be taught in the country.

Crime detection in Michigan is getting valuable assistance at Schoolcraft College where an intensive course in the use of the microscope is being conducted by a world-renowned expert.

The teacher is Dr. Walter C. McCrone, who heads teaching laboratories in Chicago and London. His students are 36 officers and civilian employees of the Michigan State Police, the Detroit Police Department, and the Michigan Department of Health.

Two one-week courses in microscopy are being conducted by Dr. McCrone. This intensive training in the use of an investigation with the microscope. Special emphasis is focused on the identification of hair, fibers, and crystals. Crystals are a key to the identification of drugs.

LT. KEN Christensen, of the State Police scientific laboratory in Plymouth, said that bringing Dr. McCrone to large numbers of students at Schoolcraft is a marked departure from past practices when two students were sent each year to his Chicago institute for training.

He conducted a similar program in Toronto some years back, but the Schoolcraft classes are the first Dr. McCrone has taught in this country.

"Bringing Dr. McCrone here has been prompted by increasing needs for trained persons in our scientific crime detection labs," LT. Christensen said. Crime detection labs are also located in Lansing and Warren.

A practicing microscopist since 1944, Dr. McCrone

founded his teaching institute 10 years ago. His objectives are to see that microscopy and micro-chemistry are applied to problems in chemistry, medicine, ecology and criministics. He also hopes to develop rapid, dependable microanalytical methods based on the polarizing microscope.

DR. MCCRONE holds bachelor and doctorate degrees from Cornell University. He is publisher and editor of "Microscope," an international journal of

microscope. He has authored over 160 scientific papers, chapters, and books.

Two persons who were instrumental in originating the current classes are Lt. Bobby Taylor of the Detroit police scientific lab, and Capt. Wallace VanStrait of the State Police investigation service section.

The class at Schoolcraft was arranged by Lt. Christensen in cooperation with Dean Fred Stefanski of the college. Schoolcraft offers a two-year course leading to the associate degree in law enforcement.

## Health Food Store Expands

Zerbo's Health Foods has doubled the size of its store at 34164 Plymouth, Livonia, and remodeled the front of the 14-year-old store.

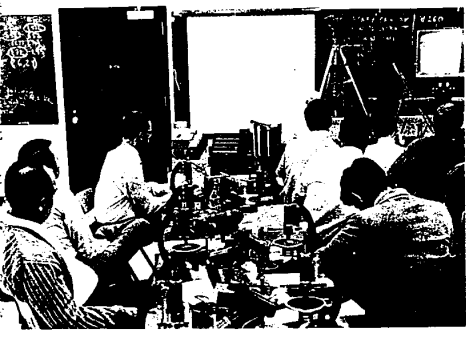
Harry Zerbo said the 1,500-square-foot facility has been expanded to nearly 3,000 square feet with the acquisition of the shoemaker and barber shop next door.

The new front has rustic wood styling. Zerbo has also purchased 100 feet of frontage to expand his parking space.

The store will celebrate during the first week of February with an open house at which it will give free samples of soybeans. "You eat them like peanuts," said Zerbo.

The expansion was necessary, he said, by the booming interest in ecology and health foods of the last two or three years. "People are worried about pollution, but we've got one of the most polluted streams inside our bodies," he said, referring to the bloodstream.

The family-run store, which draws customers from as far away as Toledo and Muskegon, is using air freight to bring in fresh foods from California growing without artificial fertilizers.
