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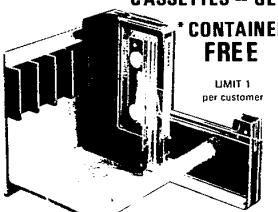
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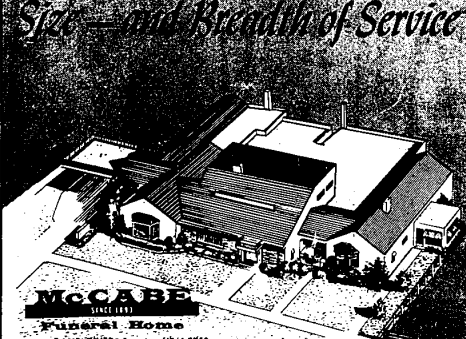
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C'ville Adopts Goals Statement

"The Common Goals of Michigan Education," a general outline of state educational goals, has been officially supported by the Clarenceville Board of Education.

The four-page statement of goals, compiled by the State Department of Education, was unanimously adopted by the Clarenceville Board at its Jan. 13 meeting.

The common goals are divided into the three following categories:

- Citizenship and morality—morality; and citizenship and social responsibility.
- Democracy and equal opportunity—equality of educational opportunity; education of the non-English

speaking person; education of the exceptional person; allocation of financial resources; parental participation and community participation.

- Student learning—basic skills; preparation for a changing society; career preparation; creative, constructive and critical thinking; sciences, arts and humanities; physical and mental well-being; self-worth; social skills and understanding; occupational skills; preparation for family life; environmental quality; economic understanding; and continuing education.

The state's statement of goals also outlines four programs aimed at upgrading the educational system. They are: quality teaching; accountability; assessment and evaluation; and research and development.

Clarenceville Supt. David B. McDowell said the state Department of Education had been urging local districts to adopt a set of goals for some time. He said the state goals were adopted here because they were already drawn up and might figure in state assessments.

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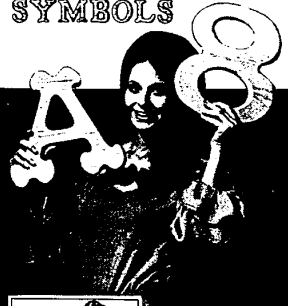


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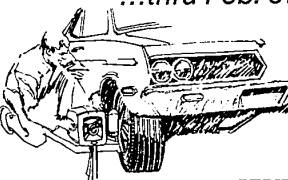
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
