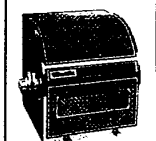

Drummond said, he "something between lethargic gradualism and revolution."

"I don't want to patch up the system that's not good enough—and I certainly don't want to tear it down," he added.

But he suggested that the President might be empowered to move more quickly in many areas—such as the raising or lowering of the income tax—unless Congress acted to stop him.

There was a two-year delay in tax reduction, he said and added:

"We can't wait that long." Drummond also said he favored an end to the seniority system in Congress and unlimited filibustering, and was inclined to oppose decentralization because "the capacity of government to govern must be equal to the magnitude of the problems, and our biggest problems are national in scope."

ANOTHER CHANGE Drummond thinks advisable is a new method of choosing a vice president.

Predicting that President Richard Nixon might well pick either Treasury Secretary Tom Connolly or New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller as his running mate, he pointed out that the "choice will be Nixon's alone, and that's regrettable."

"I have reached the conclusion that the vice president is too important an official to leave the choice to one man—even if he is the President," Drummond said. That drew one of the several rounds of applause from the Town Hall audience.

Of Vice President Spiro Agnew, Drummond commented "he's a bright fellow and a better public servant than his image, and he was more right than wrong in his charges against the press and television, though he lacked documentation."

DRUMMOND PREDICTED—more or less by the process of elimination—that Sen. Edmund Muskie of Maine would be the Democratic presidential nominee.

"I think Muskie and Humphrey will pool their strength if either sees he cannot win the nomination," he added, "and the odds seem generally to favor the nomination of Muskie."

"TURNING from crystal ball to his topic of the day, 'Is Our Democracy in Peril?', Drummond said he really thought 'peril' too strong a word but 'trouble' would be accurate.
