Citizens To Mull Sidewalk Needs

FARMINGTON Township Board has authorized a citizens study committee to investigate the problem of sidewalks along main thoroughfares in the community.

The seven-member committee will be named at the Feb. 14 meeting with each township board member appointing a committee member.

Motion to create the committee was made by Trustee Earl Opperhauser, supported by Treasurer Thomas Nolan, and passed 6-0.

THE BOARD has authorized its attorney to begin lawsuits against those developers who have failed to meet with ordinance requirements for sidewalks for subdivisions along mile roads.

Opperhauser noted that Thompson-Brown Co. officials have mentioned the practical problems of locating sidewalks which begin nowhere and end nowhere and problems caused by terrain.

"Maybe we should investigate these problems and come up with recommendations on how to solve them," Opperhauser said the

SUPERVISOR Earl Teeples said he has been working with developers to get sidewalks and would like to follow through on these meetings before a committee is formed.

Opperhauser answered the committee could function without delaying the lawsuits or the efforts being made by the supervisor.

Trustee Margaret Schaefer commented there are other areas besides subdivisions where sidewalks should be required and these other areas could be studied by the committee.

IN OTHER action, the board reappointed Richard Wallace to a two-year term to the township pension board.

Andrew Sroka was appointed to the tax board of review as a replacement for Hal Rowe who is stepping down. Sroka is an architect who has had experience appraising property as a real estate man.

The board also voted to elect four constables in the 1972 general election. The action was taken following discussion by Trustee Fred Lichtman on whether constables were needed.

The board also gave final plan approval for Kings Pointe subdivision being developed by Marvin Rollins. Bond for the park escrow was set at \$25,000 with \$6,500 required to be posted for the first phase of development.

Rollins is planning to develop 21 acres of parkland, including a storm basin area which is part of the Minnow Pond drain, with 4.5 acres developed in the first phase. The first step involves construction on 43 of the total 145 platted lots.
