

Safety Record

At midnight, February 8, Winnetka, Ill., achieved the unusual record of four continuous years without a single traffic fatality. U. S. Watershed

THE GARDEN PATH

Sow turnips during late July and during August for fall crop. Late turnips may be preserved until spring by cutting off the tops one inch from the bulb, storing in the cellar during winter, and covering the roots with dry sand. Harvest before severe frost sets in.

For a late crop of beets, sow from late July to mid-August. Late beets can be kept for winter use by packing the roots in slightly moist earth in a cool cellar.

Sow carrots in late July for fall use.

Sow kohlrabi in late July for a fall crop. Should be used when young; large bulbs will be woody.

In mid-August sow some extra-early sorts of peas for fall use.

Sow seed for winter radishes in late July and during August. These should be dug before frost and stored in a cellar.

Sow spinach in September for a fall crop.

In preparing the soil for these fall crops, be sure to incorporate a complete plant food in the seedbed, as this will assure rapid development and hasten maturity. Where a soil supports more than one crop in a season, as in successive sowing, feeding is especially important.

Grow Goldenrod for Rubber
Growing 500 acres of specially developed strains of goldenrod for experimental purposes in the production of war vital rubber is now a project around Waynesboro, Ga. Rootings grown at the United States department of agriculture's plant introduction gardens at Savannah will be used, and celery transplant machines employed for the operation. Land leased for growing goldenrod is in areas not devoted to raising essential food crops.

Make your entertaining as simple as possible. If someone in your family has a reason to celebrate, make it an occasion and have a party. Don't spend unnecessary time and energy on real "party fare". A simple layer cake and a delicious drink of some sort is all that is needed for a touch of gaiety.

Fruit juices with their high nutritional food value are the perfect bases for drinks at any time. And they make much better

drinks when mixed the new way, with sparkling water or club soda. The true fresh fruit flavor and the tang of sparkling water is an unbeatable combination, and it is bound to be popular with the children as well as with adults. It is also an excellent way to combine food value with refreshment. You might try serving orangeade made this delicious way. Here's the recipe:

Sparkling Orangeade
Juice of 1 orange 1 tsp. sugar (dissolved in juice)
Ice cubes Sparkling water
Pour the orange juice and sugar over the ice cubes which have been placed in tall glasses. Fill the glasses with sparkling water and stir gently. Slices of fresh fruit, cherries or a sprig of mint may be used as a garnish.

BRAISED HEART WILL MAKE A TASTY DINNER

Many housewives have never used heart as a meat because they really didn't know how to cook it. Here is a very fine tasty recipe.

BRAISED BEEF HEART WITH VEGETABLES
4 or 1 1/2 lbs. beef heart
1 lb. shortening
2 cups boiling water
6 small carrots
10 small onions
4 cups cubed potatoes
2 cups tomato juice
3 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. pepper
3 lbs. enriched flour
1/2 cup water

Remove arteries and veins from heart. Wash well and let stand in cold water for one hour. Drain and dry. Melt the shortening in large, heavy saucepan or Dutch oven and brown the heart. Add the boiling water, cover and cook slowly for three hours. Add carrots and onions and cook for 1/2 hour. Add potatoes, tomato juice and seasonings and cook 1/2 hour longer. Make a thickening of the flour and water. Add to the meat and vegetable mixture. Serves 8.

Says Rate of Rejections Due to Youth Coddling

Coddling of the nation's youth by automobiles, double feature movies, and the radio is reflected in the recent War Manpower commission's announcement that more than 40 per cent of draft registrants are being rejected, according to Prof. Leon Kravitz, head of Northwestern university's department of physical education.

"Before gas rationing it was a common practice to see youngsters riding to school in the family automobile," he said. "They sit through three or four hours at a stretch in the movies and then lounge before the radio for several more hours. These practices are going on at a time when the youngsters should be building bodies for the future."

"We are not beginning in this country to do a proper job of training our youth in helpful physical pursuits. When physical education was introduced it was not meant as a play period, but to take the place of something we had lost, namely muscular activity."

Americans have fallen a long way from physical grace, in Kravitz's opinion. They have glorified the white collar worker and abandoned the use of the hands except for getting food, the body and dressing themselves. Even walking is avoided whenever possible, he said.

Use Radar for Detection

In operation, radar sends out radio waves which are reflected back to sensitive receivers when a ship or plane enters the area which the radio waves cover. Returning waves are then plotted, and by a complicated system of calculations, officers determine the position, direction of travel, and speed of enemy planes or ships and then relay the information to interceptor forces.
