"Johnny Got His Gun" is a devastating film.

Now showing at the Terrace Theatre in Livonia, the film is strongly recommended for all persons who think war is worth the price in human destruction.

Based on Dalton Trumbo's novel written after World War I (and published two days after the start of World War II), it concentrates the real essence of war into one man.
