

Avoid Exaggerations--Kelley

Kelley noted that at the dawn of World War II, California Attorney General Earl Warren ruled it was proper to arrest American citizens who happened to be Japanese, confiscate their homes, and throw them in concentration camps.

"SOME OF US see our history as one great advancement toward enlightenment. If we believe our country has never had any serious internal division, we will panic when we realize we have divisions now and be

tempted towards hasty and foolish actions.

"But if we realize today's division is not unprecedented, we will ride out the storm. Each new society's problems have been over-discussed and viewed as an harbinger of destruction.

"Ideas compete for attention in a free society... exaggeration may be a natural tendency of those who feel a serious need has been left undiscussed."

He cited organized crime, ecology and prison reform as serious problems ignored until recently which now are being

exaggerated and over-discussed.

"In a free society, we must keep our perspective or, as the younger set would say, 'keep our cool.' The hallmark of a mature individual is whether he can view problems in terms of time and his surroundings."

CITIZENS must develop a sense of perspective and realize life will continue despite today's burning issues. It is easy to send out a message, he added, but next to impossible to call it back after its emotional inoculation has hit.

Each step we take towards rationalization and reasoning will be a step towards a better society," Kelley concluded, "and each man can take that step by himself."

During the question-period, Kelley said he supported the concept of no-fault auto insurance, adding that 80 percent of the cases on the court are divorce and auto accident suits.

The Roth federal court decision that Detroit schools are segregated, Kelley said, is a matter of first impression and will be appealed all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court. There is a great deal of exaggeration about bussing,

Kelley added, because persons have chosen to become more involved in the emotions of the situation instead of thinking it through.

CHILDREN in the inner city have the right to be placed in a better environment, Kelley noted, but it makes little sense to say the suburban child should be placed in a bad environment to equalize educational opportunities.

Kelley said he believes the property tax to support schools is unconstitutional because it is applied unequally. He argued the fair system of taxation would be an income tax with local communities having the opportunity to levy an enrichment property tax.

Kelley mentioned that in the United States last year 33 cents of each tax dollar was spent for defense and only two cents of each tax dollar for elementary and secondary education.

After his speech, Kelley was presented a key to Farmington Township by Supervisor Earl Teeples.

About 95 persons attended Wednesday's night dinner which is the largest crowd ever to show up for a Chamber annual meeting.

Continued from Page 1A reports, and decided to do something different," Miss Giachino explained.

"Mr. Isaacs (of the consumers protection division) said he wouldn't have had the guts to arrange an interview with the attorney general when he was young. He thought it was great."

Besides the right to vote to drink, Kelley spoke to the young women about being responsible for keeping up payments on cars they now could buy, on being liable for terms of contracts they enter into, on the fact that they now can be sued, are subject to more criminal laws and are subject to jury duty.

"We learned it's not all fun and games," Miss Eckel commented. "There's a lot of responsibility as well."

THE ATTORNEY general's concern, the young women said, was that many young people who are disinterested in politics and government are unaware of their new responsibilities and "might get into contracts and be hit by a lawyer they don't know about."

But Kelley has "great confidence in kids," they agreed, and believes the 18-year-olds are mature enough to "handle the law."

Interviews with community college students, on the other hand, disclosed that many young persons have qualms

about their capability as voters.

"Some said they won't vote until they are 21," the girls said, "because they feel they are not well enough informed."

The majority indicated they intend to investigate candidates and issues on their own, not follow their parents' lead.

Kelley expects the young voters to be "a lot more demanding of candidates," the young reporters said. They quoted him as saying candidates "are going to have to prove their honesty."
