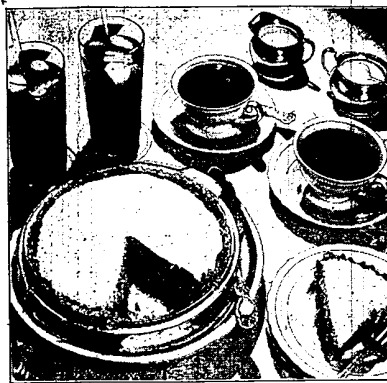
Teach your children to find joy in the small things in life and they'll never want for happiness. Bye now.

An Old Favorite with a New Flavor



SUCH a foldtime favorite as Chiffon Pie is especially good when the unexpected and delicious flavor of coffee is added. It is a "welcome change" just try this on your family some day soon and watch them come back for second helpings. Remember that in addition to the pleasure of drinking coffee you can use it as a flavoring many times when the recipe calls for some scarce or hard-to-get flavor. Served with coffee, hot or cold, this Coffee Chiffon Pie makes a perfect dessert for any meal.

This recipe for Coffee Chiffon Pie is simple, delicious and it has the advantage of requiring practically no cooking. The filling is equally good when used with corn cake or graham cracker pastry or a regular baked pastry shell. Serve it with full strength coffee and you have a dessert the whole family

will enjoy. Tall glasses of refreshing iced coffee or teeming hot cups of this energizing beverage will appeal to all. Here is the recipe for Coffee Chiffon Pie.

Coffee Chiffon Pie
1 tablespoon gelatin
1 1/2 cups cold water
1/2 cup sugar
2 egg yolks
1/2 cup beaten cream
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup coffee

Soften gelatin in 1/2 cup coffee. Add 1/4 cup sugar gradually to beaten egg yolks. Add coffee and salt and blend. Cook over boiling water 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Add softened gelatin and stir until thoroughly dissolved. Chill until mixture begins to thicken. Beat remaining sugar gradually into beaten egg whites, and fold into coffee mixture. Pour into 8-inch pie shell made with corn cake or graham cracker pastry, or into a baked pastry shell.

DISGUISE LIVER IF YOUR FAMILY TIRES OF IT

This is a rather unusual way to serve liver, which is becoming more and more popular on the family table. Liver is not only one of the most nutritious of meats but lends itself to a variety of ways to serve it.

SUPPER SHORTCAKE

1 1/2 lbs. pork liver
4 lbs. bacon fat
6 strips bacon
1 1/2 tsp. salt
Pepper
1 cup milk
- 1 cup stock off liver
1 recipe biscuit dough

Cook liver in boiling salted water until tender. Drain. Fry bacon crisp, remove from skillet. Blend the flour in the 4 tablespoons bacon fat. Add seasonings. Add milk and stock, cook, stirring constantly until thick. Cube liver, add to the sauce and heat. Pat out biscuit dough for 9-inch pan. Bake 15 minutes in hot oven. Serve liver and bacon on shortcake. Serves six.

Dyes From Cabbages

By reason of the shortage of coal tar dyes, German chemists are reported to be making colors from red cabbage, according to a report in the European press. The dye obtained is known as "caulene" and forms the basis for a series of blue and green colors.

THE GARDEN PATH

I don't know whether your lawn has suffered as ours has of late, but everything we have had has been against us, from the weather to the fact that the lawnmower was no good. Consequently, instead of having a nice smooth velvety lawn it has been more like a hay field. So this fall is going to find us very busy trying to recondition that nice green lawn that surrounds the house, the one we worked so many years to get in shape in the first place.

First, it will have to be whipped or scythed down somewhat. Leave these cuttings lay and dry for a day and then rake them well. Some of you will just put them on the compost pile, but we have found them very good for bedding for the calf, rabbits and chickens. Rake down good in order to get the dead grass matted close to the ground. That is one of the things that happens when the grass is allowed to go to weeds. It chokes the grass out completely.

Bare spots must then be seeded with a good grass seed. It is a matter of choice, but I prefer one that has lots of clover in it. Clover grows very easy and soon will choke out the undesirable weeds. Seeding it is ideal for the home that has no outside water facilities and must depend on the weather for its moisture.

After the seed has been scattered it is well to rake it in a wee bit, so that the first stray breeze doesn't come along and blow it where it isn't wanted. Then roll it well. The fall rains will do the rest and in the spring the new grass is just waiting for the first warm sun to come and pull it forth into the sunshine. A little cooperation on the part of dogs and neighbor children is a big help in getting a new lawn started.

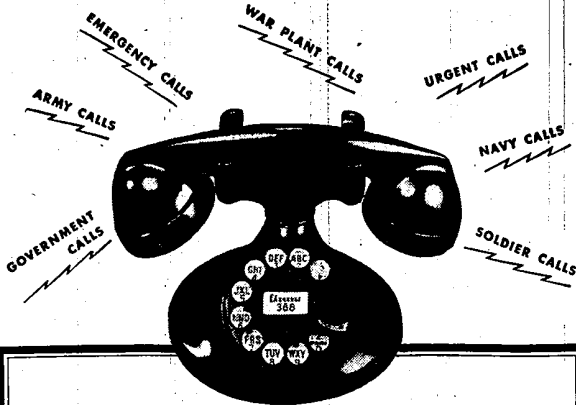
