WAR BOND LOAN Buy More Bonds

Bond Sale Lags Far Behind Community's Quota

September, 1943, will always be remembered as the month of the Third War Loan Drive. But whether that drive is to be remembered as a most successful undertaking, or not, yet hangs in the balance. Joseph Himmelspach, chairman of the Bond Sales Committee for the City and Township of Farmington, reported that sales for the first fourteen days of October totaled \$21,038.50. This amount represents the actual cash that has been put into Bonds, not the nominal value of the sum \$30,325 which was collected at the Post Office, \$3,907.25 at the Civic Theatre and \$11,100.00 at Farmington State Bank.
