

### Residential Year-Round Conservation

- 1. Cook whole meals in oven. Cook one-dish meals on sop burners.
- 2. Do not light top burners until cooking utensils are in place.
- 3. Do not use running hot water for washing dishes or hands. Repair lerky fauces. Heat and use no more water than is necessary.
- 4. Never leave refrigerator door open. Cool sooked foods before placing in
