

Local Women Set For ACLD Meet

Mrs. Norma Ringquist of Farmington will head a local delegation to the ninth annual International Conference of the Association for Children with Learning Disabilities, scheduled Feb. 2 to 5 in Atlantic City.

Mrs. Ringquist is president of the Farmington chapter of the Michigan Association for Children with Learning Disabilities and will coordinate the next international conference, to be held in Detroit's Cobo Hall in March of 1973.

Other members of the local delegation are Mrs. Nan Hinrichson, past president of the MACLD, Diane Dingman, Neva Weidig, Kathie Eubank and Virginia Callahan.

The conference in Atlantic City has as its theme "Our Challenge: The Right to Know," and is expected to attract some 5,000 educators, parents, physicians, psychologists and social workers.

Current theories and philosophies of child development and techniques for helping the child who has trouble learning will be discussed.

The Association for Children with Learning Disabilities is a non-profit federated organization dedicated to advancing the education and well-being of children with perceptual, conceptual or coordinative difficulties.

It was founded in Illinois in 1946 and now has some 300 chapters all over the country.

THE PUBLIC is invited to the workshops which start at 10 a.m., under the theme, "The Price of Peace is Justice." The workshops will examine "The Alcoholic - The Drug Addict," "The Imprisoned in Need of Rehabilitation," "The Displaced in Housing," "The Youthful Offender," "Women in Government and Politics," "Victims of Racism," "Senior Citizens," and "The Dispossessed in Welfare."

Registration, at \$5 per person, is from 9 to 9:45 a.m. The cost includes the workshops, the luncheon and the afternoon session. There is free parking. Child care is available on advance request. Reservations may be made at the Democratic Party Headquarters, 1535 E. Lafayette Street, Detroit.

At the 12:15 luncheon, Edith Van Horn, international representative of the UAW-CAP, the united community action program, will speak on "Women as Liberators."
