
W.S.C.S. PLANS PROGRAM FOR THANKSGIVING

November 3, 1943

I'm sending you this letter to thank you for the paper and also to give you my new address. I look forward to the paper every week and I read every item. I enjoy the service notes most of all because they inform me of the whereabouts of my buddies, and how they're doing. I myself ended up in the Medical Corps which I wasn't too pleased with at first, but every job is important so we all have to do our best. I'm in hopes that before long all us fellows can come home to good old Farmington.

Well, I have an awful lot of studying to do tonight so I'll close for this time. Again I thank you for the Farmington paper.

Dear Editor:

I am writing this letter to thank you and the staff for sending me the paper every week, which I have been receiving every week since I have been in this camp.

I have been in Camp Ellis, Illinois, since the 15th of April. I should have written a long time ago and thanked you for the paper. I was always going to write, but I just kept putting it off and saying that I would stop in and see you when I came home again. When I got home the time always seemed to fly so fast that I never got time to go and see you.

I have been home once a month ever since I have been down here. I have been awful lucky to get home so often compared to some of the fellows I know.

I will tell you a little bit about the camp I am in. It is just a new camp. Our outfit was the first one to come to this camp. Our barracks are of the one story type and each one holds 50 men. The camp was built in the middle of what used to be some large corn fields. The corn stalks have all disappeared now, and in their place is some nice green grass.

I guess I have better close for this time and get this mailed before the lights go out. I again thank you for the paper.
