Somewhere in Italy  
December 14, 1943

Dear Editor:  
If this letter should end quite  
abruptly, and have me lying in a  
lost airplane, or going down with  
a torpedoed battleship, don't worry  
'cause I'm o.k., except I'm ex-  
pecting my typing arm to give out  
most any minute. WHY? Be-  
cause I had several shots in it  
yesterday, and today it's as life-  
less as a log. It sure was a pitiful  
sight at reveille this morning  
— never saw so many droopy look-  
ing soldiers in all my life; every-  
one sagging at the shoulders, and  
faces longer than a cow's. There  
was absolutely none of the usual  
handshaking or back patting, and  
the fellows avoided walking with-  
in striking distance of each other.  
Most unseemly bunch you could  
wish to see. It gets sort of hard  
on the ears listening to everyone  
shouting back and forth at one an-  
other.

Everything here is going along  
pretty well, although most of us  
are getting a little weary of the  
sky juice we have almost daily.  
Tomorrow I am going up to the  
storm and go to town and get  
my O.D.'s pressed, (while I wait)  
and of course must take my Eng-  
lish-Italian dictionary along so I  
can carry on an intelligent book  
conversation with the Guineas. I  
only hope I can wave my arms and  
hands at the proper moments, and  
be as persuasive as they are with  
their torso movements! My Italian  
discourages me at times 'cause  
I sail down and memorize a few  
phrases, and then with my chest  
puffed out, I rattle them off at  
some dago, only to have him shrug  
his shoulders and say "non capis-  
co." (don't understand). Maybe  
it's my Northern accent, eh?

Perhaps I should stop beating  
it around the bush and really get  
down to the reason why I am writ-  
ing, although it is quite obvious  
to thank you most sincerely for  
your excellent paper which finds  
its way across the big blue Atlantic,  
through the beautiful Mediterrean,  
and into a land of "Bloody  
Battle Fields." It is impossible  
for me to put into words, the ex-  
act thoughts of praise I have for  
the staff of the Enterprise. The way  
they have kept the soldiers of  
Farmington in contact with each  
other through the "Service Notes,"  
and also the happenings on the  
home front.

I would like, through the Enter-  
prise, to thank the "Blue Star  
Magazines" for their most welcomed  
Christmas package, and the mem-  
bers of the Farmington Baptist  
Church for their faithfulness in  
writing, even though it is impos-  
sible for me to answer their much  
looked for letters. I'm proud to  
be able to say that Farmington is  
one town which is behind its sol-  
diers one hundred per cent, and  
can rest assured it will always  
keep up its good work.
