Dr. Frederick L. Marriott, official organist of the Detroit Symphony and organist-caviloneur for Kirk-in-the-Hills, Bloomfield Hills, will play a recital when St. John Lutheran Church of Farmington dedicates its new Wicks pipe organ Sunday, Feb. 6.

His dedicatory recital will begin at 7 p.m. in the church located at 23225 Gill, and an informal reception will follow. The public is invited.

FORMAL DEDICATION of the organ will take place during the 8:30 and 11 a.m. services, with the Rev. Charles Fox, St. John pastor, officiating.

Dr. Marriott has planned a varied program, including works of Bach, Dupre, Franck and Widor, as well as his own fantasies on familiar hymn tunes, "O Sacred Head" and "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God."

A MUSICIAN famed in the art of impromptu improvisation, he will climax the program by improvising on a theme to be submitted to him the night of the recital.
