procure an additional 2,635  
books to meet North Central  
requirements.  
At its meeting Tuesday  
night, the board also received  
a letter from the University of  
Michigan accreditation  
department praising Harrison  
as an "outstanding" school.  
The letter said Harrison  
"meets or exceeds all of U-M's  
standards for accreditation."  
The U-M letter also praised  
student-teacher ad-  
ministrator relations at the new  
high school.

The in-service classes are  
held each Tuesday and  
Thursday morning for two  
hours. One half of the day shift  
will be in the morning on Tuesday  
and the other half will receive  
the same instruction on  
Thursday.  
Classes are taught by Holko,  
a legal advisor assigned by  
Oakland County to the  
department, and officers  
within the department.  
Officers are being sent to  
classes to receive instructor's  
training.  
The in-service program  
stresses instruction in the day-  
to-day work problems of  
police officers. This past  
week, for instance, training  
highlighted the search and  
seizure procedures.  
Holko said he is also sending  
one officer per month to the  
Oakland Police Academy and  
police school at Michigan  
State University. These  
courses usually last one or two  
weeks.
