APPLICATIONS FOR INVESTIGATOR ARE BEING TAKEN

A competitive examination for the purpose of filling the position of Investigator in the United States Civil Service Commission, in the States of Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin, was announced today by the United States Civil Service Commission. This position pays \$2,145 per annum for a 48-hour week. The United States Civil Service Commission states that applicants must have at least three years of full time experience in either (1) making investigations in connection with prosecutions of civil or criminal cases, (2) the general practice of law which included the actual presentation of cases in court or investigations in connection with the preparation of cases for trial, or (3) in responsible positions which required the exercise of initiative, tact, independent judgment, and resourcefulness in dealing with the public.

Applicants may substitute, year for year, up to a maximum of 2 years, completed courses leading to a bachelor's degree in a college or university of recognized standing, but in no case may education be substituted for more than 2 years of the required experience. Persons with legal, accounting, or business administration education are particularly desired.

Applications will be accepted until the needs of the service have been met. All interested persons who meet the above requirements should obtain an application form from the Local Secretary, at any first or second-class post office in which notice regarding this position is posted, and mail it without delay to the Civil Service Commission in Chicago, Illinois.

Applications are not desired from persons engaged on war work unless the position applied for, calls for the use of higher skills than the worker is now using in his present employment.
