If you sent boxes to all of those men whose names are on the Bulletin Board in front of the Town Hall (and I suppose you did) you surely must have put in a lot of time and effort, and God bless you all.

I received my box in very good shape and everything in it was wonderful! Needless to say, it was shared by quite a few others in my group and there were plenty of comments, "Gee, they didn't forget anything, did they?" and "How do you rate this anyway?" and various other remarks. Thanks a million for the thoughtfulness.

This Christmas is considerably different for me than the last one. I managed to get home last time just for one day, but this year I'm not so lucky. Not you understand, that the "Powers that be" at Camp Crowder are hard-hearted, (because a number of boys from here will be home) but because some few have to stay around, and I volunteered because it takes 44 hours for a round trip from here and it would not be very practical to make the trip, considering that I would have only about three hours at home, which would be worse than none at all.

Camp Crowder isn't too bad a place. The main trouble with it is that it's so far from any city of any size and transportation is difficult. I've been here since the sixth of May and have only been off the Post a few times. Meals are excellent and living quarters are quite comfortable. As far as weather is concerned, we've only had about three cold days so far this winter and most of the time it isn't necessary to wear an overcoat.

My work continues to be interesting. At present I am on duty at Headquarters and somehow manage to get dragged into everything that comes along, which keeps me on my toes and busy

for about twelve hours a day, six days a week.  
Well, folks, guess I'd better sign off now, since I have other letters to write and not too much time. Thanks again for everything.
