## EDITORIALS

### "We, the People--"

Although personally he did not approve it and would have preferred a much stronger central government—even a monarchy—Alexander Hamilton, American, led the political fight for the adoption of the Constitution.

The words and intent of the Constitution are unmistakably clear—in the Preamble as in the body. "We, the People of the United States," it reads, "in order to form a more perfect Union, establish justice..."

Unmistakably it was the people of the United States, endeavoring to create a unit among them, who did "ordain and establish this Constitution"—the inspired document under which our country has grown into a great and strong democracy.

It was Alexander Hamilton, again, who held that the people's liberties must always depend upon the spirit of the people themselves, and of their government.

It was George Washington, whose birthday we celebrate with even more than usual significance in this fateful year of 1914, who said in his Farewell Address:

"But let there be no change (of the Constitution) by usurpation; for though this, in one instance, may be the instrument of good, it is the customary weapon of usurpation by which free governments are destroyed."

We have no thought or will to change our Constitution today. We want the same kind of country after the war that we had before—only better. We're not even considering the possibility of any permanent change in the pattern of American democracy.

Criticism always comes so easy. The minute one is displeased by any governmental tactic or agency, it is so easy to let expressions of criticism escape us. Just remember that we, through our spirit and outlook, have determined what our government is, and just how much liberty we may enjoy. Likewise, it is up to us to see that we have a future government that is to our liking. Now is the time that we must form the basis of this post-war period. This is the American way of doing things—it is our way.

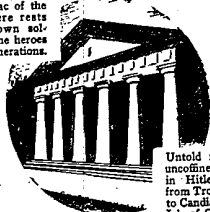
