#### Lowly Fanweed Yields Oil Of Economic Importance

Chemists have struck new sources of oil in the rank and lowly fanweed. or oil in the rank and lowly fanweed.

Prof. H. O. Triebold and J. R. Clopton, agricultural biochemists at the Pennsylvania State college, have discovered that fanweed or penny-cress seed is about one-third oil, of a quality that may be of great economic Importance.

The properties of fanweed oil are similar to those of rapeseed oil which has been used in blending lu-bricating oil for high temperature work


