Farmington drew a game with East Detroit for Wednesday evening at 9:15 p.m. Farmington won this game by a score of 43 to 39...

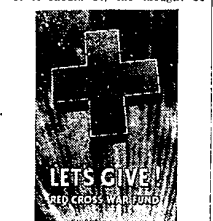
Bacon was high point man with 14 points to his credit, and Hamlin followed closely with 13...

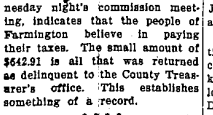
