### FLY YOUR KITE IN THE OPEN, EXPERTS ADVISE

"Build your kite frame of WOOD. Just like a Mosquito Bomber" is the advice given to youngsters today by teachers, Scout Leaders and employees of The Detroit Edison Company. "Then fly it where there are no wires. Otherwise you may lose your kite and be injured."

It was explained that flying kites near overhead wires constitutes a hazard to children whose kites or kite strings touch the wires. Flying kites away from electric lines will eliminate this danger.

In addition, the following rules were offered for kite flying safety:

Use cotton rags for kite tail. For kite string use cotton twine (no wire, tinsel or metal in cord). Wet string or any other wet material, like a wire, will conduct electricity.
