PRISONER OF WAR
MAIL SHOULD BE
CAREFULLY SENT

American Red Cross in outlining instructions about mail to prisoners of war states that military censorship regulations prohibit direct correspondence between members of the United States Armed Forces and Prisoners of War. Such mail should be sent to a friend or relative in the states, who in turn will forward it to the prisoner. There must be no information which will disclose that the writers are members of the armed forces.

Letters and cards for prisoners of war and civilian internees in Japanese controlled territory are flown from the United States to Teheran, Iran. From there this mail goes to Russia and then to a point, by Trans-Siberian railroad, where it is turned over to Japanese authorities.

Mail for prisoners of war held in France, Belgium, Yugoslavia, Poland and the Netherlands is restricted, to replies made on forms sent to correspondents in this country by prisoners.

Rusty Saws
