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New Minister To Be Installed

St. Paul's Evangelical Church, located on Middlebelt at Eight Mile Road, will witness the installation of the Rev. E. L. Stumpff as its pastor on Sunday evening at 7:30. The Rev. C. J. Danciger of Detroit will have charge of the service and the Rev. Arm. B. Born will preach the sermon. St. Paul's congregation extends a hearty welcome to all its friends to attend this impressive service.

Pastor Stumpff succeeds the Rev. Paul Granger, who asked to be released of his office this spring. Due to his advanced age. He comes from Washington, Iowa, where he served two congregations for the past three years. Previous to this pastorate, he spent sixteen years in Elkader, Iowa, where he was privileged to organize a congregation and to build a fine mission chapel.

The Rev. Mr. Stumpff spent his early years in Saginaw, where he received his education in Holy Cross Lutheran school and at Michigan Lutheran Seminary, from which he was graduated in '26. Two years later he graduated from Concordia College in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, and entered Concordia Seminary at St. Louis, Missouri. His studies here were interrupted by a year of service as assistant to the Rev. W. J. Kowert at Elgin, Illinois, and by a trip to Europe in '32, where he toured six countries on a bicycle, witnessing especially the social, political and religious conditions.

Graduating from the Seminary in '33, the Rev. Mr. Stumpff served his first assignment as assistant to the Rev. H. H. Hays at Davenport, Iowa, for six months, and then entered the missionary service of his church, being ordained in the congregation he had organized at Elkader, Iowa, in '35. Pastor Stumpff is married and has two children, Paul and Daniel. Mrs. Stumpff is the daughter of the Rev. A. W. Brauer of Key- stone, Iowa. For the past week the Stumpffs have been busy getting settled in the parsonage. The Pastor stated, "We have enjoyed our welcome here at Farmington and look forward to meeting the people of our parish and of our community."
