3 One-Acts A Bargain

FARMINGTON
Play production is an unusual type of class for a "different" group of persons, those who all have a special love for drama.
Members of Farmington High School's play production class are presenting three one-act plays Thursday, Feb. 17, at 8 p.m. in the FHS auditorium. The tickets to see all three plays are 50 cents each.

WITHIN THIS class, students have an opportunity to improve talents and ex- press themselves under the guidance of John Roscoe, drama instructor.
His students describe Roscoe as an enthusiastic man who guides them in their creative talents, be it the technical, acting or directing phases of the theatre.

Technical Director John North Says: "The gift he possesses is one which everyone has but seldom puts to use."
The class will put its talents to the fore on Feb. 17 when they present "An Evening of One Acts."
The plays to be presented are: "Improvment," "Trifles," and "Sorry, Wrong Number," "Improvment," directed by Craig Gugel and Aprille Jordan, is an experimental theatre presentation. It consists of four actors who are told to improvise a slice of life and have difficulty in keeping their inner selves from showing to the audience.

"Trifles," directed by Holly Orr and Faith Hunkeler, is a drama to point out that it is the little things in life that count. "Sorry, Wrong Number," directed by Bridget Crane and Trish Bacon, is a frightening mystery drama of a woman who overhears the planning of a murder over the telephone and cannot find anyone to prevent it from happening.

John North heads the technical direction for the plays. Mark Timmons is in charge of lighting for "Improvment" and Clay Timham the set design.
Alan Vasko created the set for "Trifles" and Jeff Hill designed the lighting plan. North also worked out the lighting plan for "Sorry, Wrong Number."
