HEATING BY REFRIGERATION . . . Your electric refrigerator "manufactures" cold. Why isn't it possible to "reverse" the refrigeration cycle and produce heat? Then, in winter you could use cold outdoor tempera-ture to heat your home! Actually, the idea isn't new. It originated with Lord Kelvin over 50 years ago. A few installations have been made—mostly in more temperate climates than Michigan's. So far, the idea isn't practical for general use, but our research engi-neers have it in their "active" file. Someday new developments may transfer it from the realm of experiment into a practical machine.



SUMMER SNACK ... For something new and different, try this recipe from our Home Service Department: Tomato and Salmon Toast

6 slices bread o vou 6 slices American cheese 12 slices 6 slices tomatoes 6 tbsp. flaked salmon, seasoned 12 slices bacon

Place a slice of cheese on each slice of bread. On top of cheese put the flaked salmon. Place tomatoes on salmon and two slices of bacon on each slice of tomato. Broil until bacon crisps and cheese pelts.
